



Request a Street Tree

Why plant street trees?

Trees create a healthier and attractive neighborhood for those who work, shop, and recreate. Street trees increase property values, cool our homes, reduce street noise, clean the air, and filter rain water runoff that leads to the Herring Run and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay.

What is a street tree?

Street trees grow in the area between your sidewalk and the street curb within the City's right of way. They can grow large and beautiful, but do not tend to crack sidewalks or break pipes.

If you want a NEW STREET TREE OR TREES planted, Then all you need to do is:

1. Own the house at the requested location.
2. Agree to water the tree weekly for its first two years and
3. Give the city permission to plant the tree by completing the form

YES! I WANT A FREE STREET TREE PLANTED!

I give the City of Baltimore, Baltimore County or HRWA permission to plant a tree in the right-of-way along my house or business. I agree to water the street tree planted in the public right-of-way at the below locations. We understand that some locations may not be suitable for trees due to utilities, signs, or width of sidewalk and that the agency listed above shall make final determinations of suitable locations and species. The trees, once planted, will be property of The City of Baltimore or Baltimore County. By signing this form you agree to the above conditions and facts.
